Introduction of SAMIS Report, FY 2010-2011



As part of city government, the Jacksonville Children's Commission (the Commission) recognizes its responsibility to invest in our city's most precious resource---our children. We work hand in hand with local private non-profits to improve the health and lives of all children living in Duval County. The Commission closely monitors all funded agencies and tracks all programs for quality and measurable outcomes.

The Commission is pleased to provide this detailed supplemental Services and Activities Management Information System (SAMIS) report for FY 2010-2011. SAMIS provides a one-page snapshot of youth development, special needs and Healthy Families programs that are funded by the Commission. This year, the report also provides a brief outline of early literacy programs, although it is in a slightly different format.

For the past several years, the Commission has been utilizing the SAMIS software system, in concert with other Children's Services Councils throughout Florida. SAMIS was created not only to track the race, gender, age and income status of every participant, it also monitors the overall effectiveness and performance of each funded program. It is a web-based reporting system.

Each SAMIS page cites the amount of funds provided to an agency, the number of children and families served, a description of the program. It also paints a clearer picture of the population of children and families served by providing detailed demographics.

This is the sixth SAMIS report produced by the Jacksonville Children's Commission. By adopting this computer software system, the Children's Services Councils throughout Florida are ensured a high degree of integrity and conformity in measuring program demographics and outcomes for participants.

This SAMIS report is to be used as a supplement to the Commission's annual report. It allows for an easy to understand, one-page snapshot of individual youth development programs, Healthy Families services and early literacy programs. SAMIS does not track outcomes related to other programs funded by the Commission, such as family services or childcare.

The 2010-2011 SAMIS report reveals that more than 40,220 children and families received services through youth development, summer camp and early literacy programs. An overwhelming majority (76.5 percent) of children receiving these services were living in or at the federal poverty level. Over 84.3 percent of program participants were minorities and more than 63.6 percent came from single-parent households. The bulk of Commission services were located in ZIP codes 32209, 32208, 32206, 32254, and 32218.

It is our hope that the information in this report will be a relevant and useful tool for both city leaders and community planners to measure our progress in growing great kids!

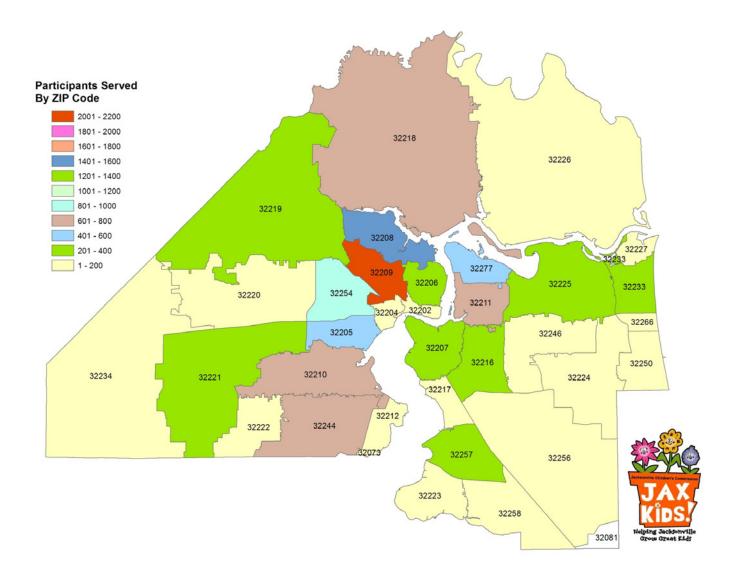

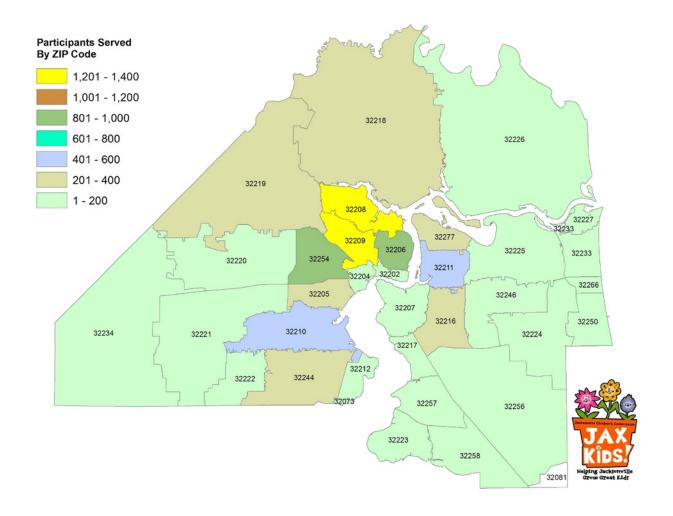

Total Participants for AII After School Programs by ZIP Code FY 2010-2011 * N=12,392



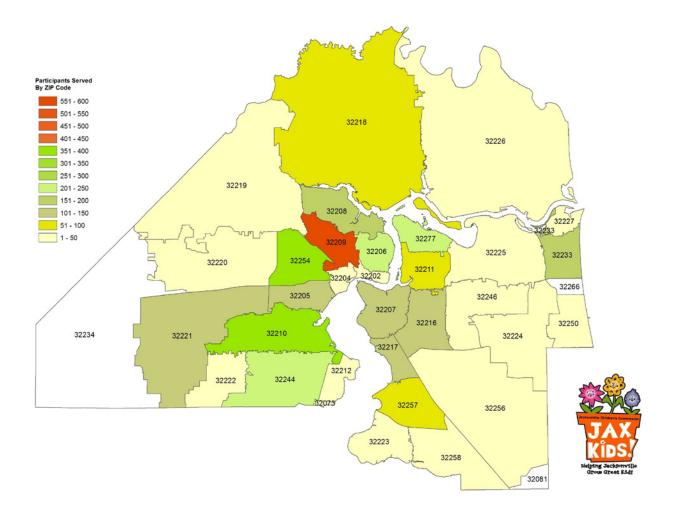

Total Participants for TEAM UP After School Programs by ZIP Code FY 2010-2011 * N=8,524



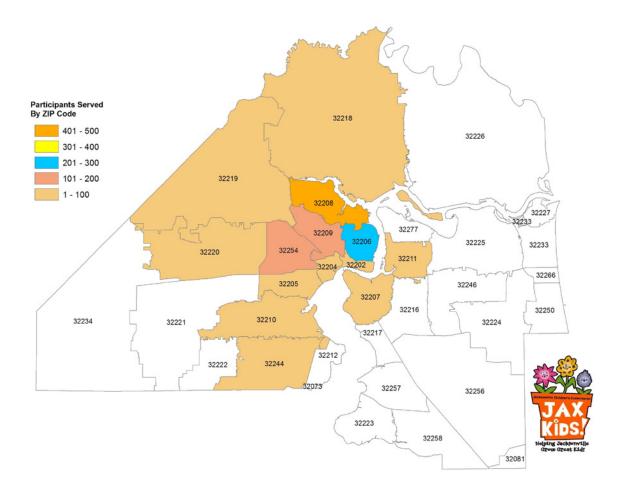

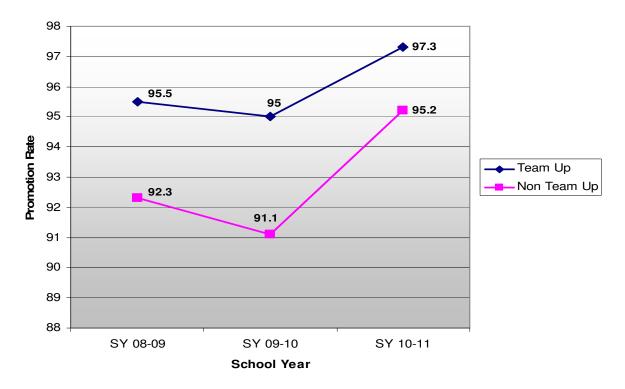

Middle School Promotion Rate for 3 Years



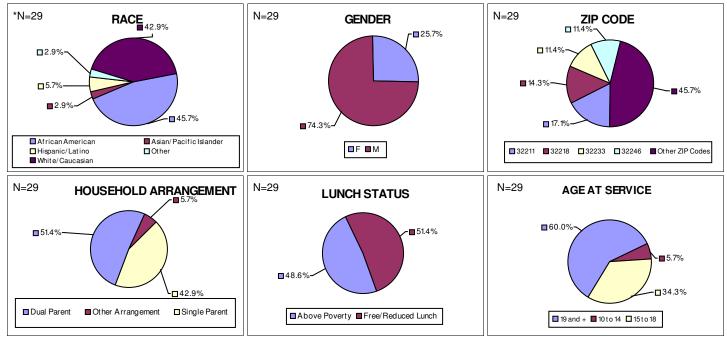

Total Participants for Community Based After School Programs by ZIP Code FY 2010-2011 * N=3,374



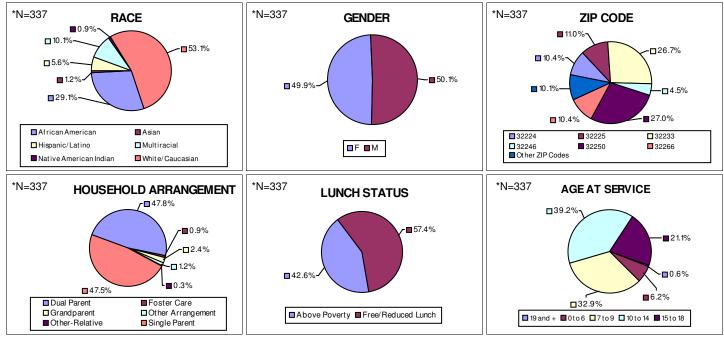

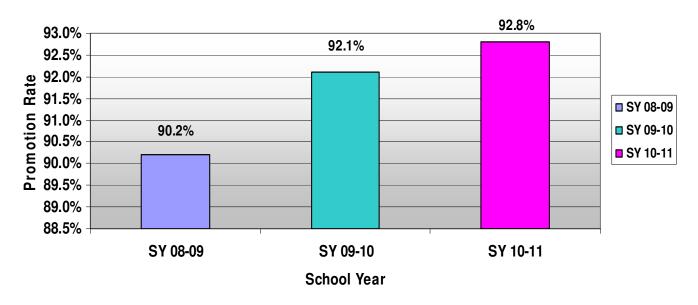

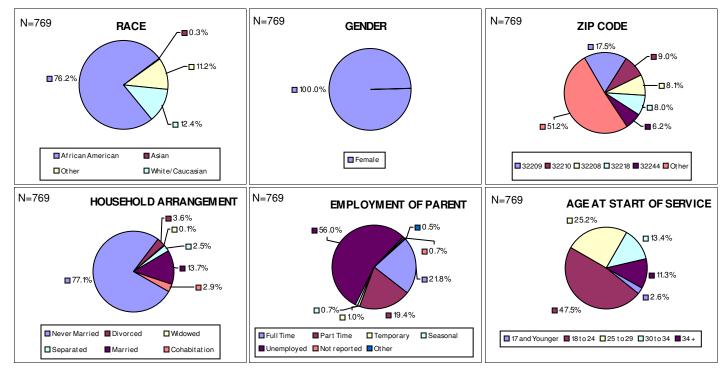

Profile of All Healthy Families Programs for FY 2010-2011 *

During FY 2010-11 the Healthy Families Jacksonville program provided services to 769 parents with young children who were living in Duval County, Florida. Healthy Families Jacksonville received \$707,200 from the State of Florida, Ounce of Prevention Fund. The Jacksonville Children's Commission matches the Healthy Family Florida dollars with an additional \$1,300,025 in city funding, for a total funding amount of \$2,007,228. These dollars support two programs with sites scattered throughout the city. The demographic charts below reveal most of the clients were single, young, minority females who had dropped out of high school and were living in the Urban Core area. For example, 76 percent of the clients were African American; 100 percent were females; 78 percent had never been married and 50 percent were under the age of 24. Over 48.8 percent of the participants lived in 32209, 32210, 32208 32218 and 32205.



*These statistics and demographics are specific to the children and families served via the Healthy Families program and do not represent the tens of thousands of other children and families benefiting from child care subsidies dollars, early literacy programs or family literacy initiatives, family services, developmental screening of infants and toddlers and/or inclusion services. There are six Alternative to Truancy and Out of School Suspension (ATOSS) Centers across the city. Students are closely monitored and required to keep their school work current. In addition, centers serve all students picked up throughout the day for truancy. 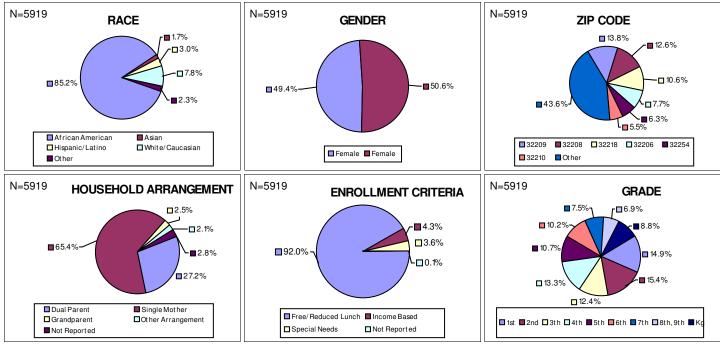
